Registration benefits those who use the services of anthroposophic health and social care professionals. It aims to:

- assure you that registrants are competent and safe in their professional practice
- provide a way for your concerns about any registrant's fitness to practise to be addressed
- give you choice of access to anthroposophic health & social care professionals through our on-line search facility.

Concerns about a registrant

If you have concerns about the service you have received from a registrant, you may complain to us about it.

We advise you first to try to sort out your concern with the registrant involved, using their complaints procedure.

If you are not happy with the outcome you may wish to tell us about it.

About the CAHSC

We are the voluntary regulator for the anthroposophic health & social care professions in the UK.

The 2000 House of Lords Select Committee report recommended that complementary health care professions not subject to statutory regulation should be responsible for self-regulating. The anthroposophic health and social care professions responded to this by setting up the CAHSC.

OUR purpose is to help protect the public by promoting good practice in anthroposophic health & social care.

To do this we:

- register professionals who meet our standards for their knowledge, skills, character and health
- set standards for practice and conduct
- specify requirements for education and training
- ensure continuing professional development
- deal with registrants whose fitness to practise is in doubt

Who do we register?

We currently register practitioners in the following professions:

- Anthroposophic Counselling and Psychotherapy
- Anthroposophic Medicine
- Anthroposophic Nursing
- Anthroposophic Pharmacy
- Anthroposophic Singing Therapy
- Anthroposophic Social Care
- Anthroposophic Therapeutic Visual Arts
- Anthroposophic Therapeutic Speech
- Eurythmy Therapy
- Rhythmical Massage Therapy

Those registered with us are called 'registrants'

Look for our Registrant logo: the quality mark for good practice in anthroposophic health and social care

ONLY those registered with us may use our 'CAHSC Registered' logo.



What is the register?

The register is a list of all anthroposophic health and social care professionals who are registered with us.

If you cannot find your health or social care professional on the register, you should assume that they are not registered.

The register gives the following details about each registrant:

- name
- profession
- registration number
- date of first registration
- date their current registration ends
- geographical area in which they work
- whether their practice is restricted or suspended

Registrants may also choose to show their:

- work address
- contact telephone number

Search the register

The register is available on-line at www.cahsc.org. If you do not have access to the internet you can contact us and we will check the register for you.

You can use our on-line register to:

- find an anthroposophic health or social care professional near you
- check that someone is registered with us.

You can search our register by name, profession, location, postcode or registration number.
